

DIRECTOR OF MUSIC AND WORSHIP

Employment Status: Full-time, exempt. Approximately 40 hours/week. Reports to Senior Pastor

How does this position "make disciples who make a difference"?

This position shapes the worshipping life of the congregation, which is the foundational act of faithfulness to God and the central experience of spiritual formation. This position also creates a culture of discipleship and fosters a sense of community in a large graded choral program from children to adults.

Primary Responsibilities

Congregational leadership

- Serves as an ex-officio member of church council
- Meets regularly with Senior Pastor and program leaders to discuss vision and strategy for the church
- Contributes to a positive team culture on the church staff, assisting beyond this position's primary responsibilities when needed or as assigned

Music Ministry leadership

- Recruits, equips, and oversees participants in the adult Chancel Choir and Chorale
- Either directs or supervises leadership of graded choral and handbell program
- Supervises a team of staff and volunteers, including the Associate Director of Music and Worship, scholarship singers, and other part-time staff as needed
- Contracts all guest musicians for worship services and special music ministry events
- Maintains all music ministry resources, including music library, instruments, operating budget, and off-budget funds

Designing Traditional Worship experience

- Meets regularly with Worship Planning Team to provide advance planning and creative expression in Worship
- Oversees the recruiting, equipping, and scheduling of volunteers and volunteer teams that support our worship, including readers, acolytes, etc.
- Serves as a regular liturgist in the traditional worship of the church, including weekly and special services, and assigns and equips other participants for these services
- Either directly, or through supervision of others, ensures all preparation for traditional worship services
- Provides or makes arrangements for sound engineering at funerals

Worship Administration

 Routinely evaluates and makes recommendations as necessary for the maintenance of essential systems and resources that support our worship, including, but not limited to: the audio systems in the sanctuary and chapel, musical instruments, vestments, and paraments
