FROM THE SENIOR PASTOR

Dear Congregation,

As many of you already know, our air conditioning system is nearing the end of its useful life. Our current setup is such that if the cooling tower were to fail, the entire campus would be without air conditioning. As fellow Mobile residents, I don't need to explain why this is such a critical issue.

Over a year ago, the trustees began prayerfully researching the best way forward to address this



challenge and ensure we have a reliable system in place. Last fall, the trustees presented a proposal to our charge conference, and with unanimous support, we began a journey to update our system and create redundancy to safeguard our campus.

In collaboration with the Finance Committee and the Dauphin Way Foundation, we have been able to pool \$600,000 of available funds. And through the generous contributions of our church family, we've received over \$470,000 through word of mouth, further demonstrating the incredible spirit of generosity and commitment within our congregation. This means that, thanks to your support, we will be able to fund Phase 1 of this project without taking on any debt. We are excited because this will set us up for success as we look toward Phase 2, which will take place in one to two years.

The first step in Phase 1 work will be to address the urgent need to repair our cooling towers, which have become badly rusted. If left unchecked, this could affect the entire campus, so this is a top priority. Other areas that will be updated include the Library, the Family Life Room, and the Bishop's Meeting Room—rooms that are essential to our community and have been affected by mildew, which we've been working tirelessly to prevent. We will also be installing variable refrigerant flow (VRF) units on the first floor of the Education Building, where our CDC classes meet. This is especially important, as we've had to rely on auxiliary units just to keep our classrooms comfortable.

The air conditioning work is scheduled to begin in mid-April and should be completed by the end of the fall. We are committed to working closely with the project manager to minimize any disruption to our ministries and programs. We also deeply appreciate your patience and flexibility as we work together to ensure the long-term well-being of our church.

These updates are more than just a series of repairs; they are an investment in the future of our church, allowing us to serve and care for our community in a way that is sustainable. With these

changes, we will have the ability to continue cooling parts of our campus even if a chiller were to fail—ensuring that we can continue our mission and ministries.

We are truly grateful for each and every one of you who has already contributed to this project, and we invite anyone who feels called to give or who has questions to reach out. Together, we are making a lasting impact on the future of our church, and we couldn't do it without you.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

March has been a fun, busy month for us in the Children's Ministry. We are welcoming lots of 4K-3rd grade children upstairs during our morning Children's Church worship times, and our Sunday evenings are full of activities, laughter, games, lessons, PIZZA, and time learning more about



God's love for each of our 4K-5th graders. It's been such a privilege to engage in kid-friendly, Godcentered worship with these engaging students, and to work beside such a dedicated group of parent volunteers each week.

We have studied parables of Jesus, including the Prodigal Son and the Woman who Anoints Jesus, and have heard the story of Zacchaeus and his life-changing meeting with God's Son. We've been exploring



the last weeks of Jesus' life, as he visited Simon in his home and met a woman there who washed His feet with her tears and precious perfume. We recently talked about Jesus and His disciples during their last Passover celebration together and will soon learn about Jesus' night of prayer and sadness in the Garden of Gethsemane.

The students planted wildflowers in pots, crafted "Jesus is My Lifesaver" trail mix, and we celebrated a foot-washing ceremony (thanks to our awesome kid volunteers, Charlotte B. and Piper W.) as we learned about humility and Christian love for others.

During other evening programming classes, our fourth and fifth graders engaged with guest visitors Christine Ford and Cindy McMillan, who talked more with the students about the best ways they can use their spiritual gifts for God. Our Jump! students are also wrapping up their month-long acolyte training. It's going to be amazing to have their participation as acolytes during worship times.

The Third Grade Bible students have discussed translations of the Bible, shared Big Questions about God with Rev. Jorgensen, built John 3:16 magnet crosses, and learned about different genres within the books of the Bible.





Our youngest students are memorizing God's Big Ideas (God helps us know what's true, We can give back to God, God sends us helpers, and God gives us second chances) by playing "popcorn" games in their classroom, and our first through third graders created a Pot of Gold for God, where they posted ways they can bless God through their interests and hobbies. They've really gotten into acting out plays to tell Bible stories, too!

We look forward to BIG events in April and would be grateful for volunteers to help make these meaningful for our children. There are many ways to get involved, from escorting students down the church aisles during the Palm Processional and helping during Children's Church at Adkins Chapel afterward, to assisting with egg and spoon races, hula hoop and bubbles games, and our Easter Egg Hunt following the Fish Fry on April 13th.

Children are encouraged to bring flowers to decorate our lovely garden cross on Easter Sunday, and will sit with their parents and a special craft during our morning services that day.

LoveMOB Sunday's going to be a lot of fun, and we have great mission activities for children and their families that afternoon.

I am especially grateful to the amazing adults who dedicate themselves weekly to work with these precious children. Our nursery staff is incredibly patient and loving with our littlest kids, and our rotation of parent volunteers who give their Sunday mornings and nights to teaching and chaperoning our students is such a blessing. Thanks for your continued prayers for this ministry.



The Staff-Parish Relations Committee generally meets in the second week of the month. Because the SPR deals with sensitive, employment-related issues, their meetings are usually open only to members. However, the SPRC chair may invite non-members to attend a particular meeting.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Generally meets in the second week of the month. The Board of Trustees is the only committee that elects its own chair. Anyone may attend a Trustees' meeting.

FINANCE

Generally meets in the third week of the month.

13 voting members include Chair, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Lay Leader, SPRC Chair, and Trustees Chair. Anyone may attend a Finance meeting.

NOMINATIONS

The Nominations Committee meets three times in August and September to prayerfully consider who to nominate as officers and committee members for Dauphin Way's leadership. The committee seeks input from all volunteer teams and also considers which members have been actively living their commitments to prayer, presence, gifts, service, and witness. Because these meetings deal with individual members of the congregation, they are strictly confidential.

LEADERSHIP REPORTS

SPRC

No Report

Trustees

The church ended February with a deficit of \$21, 905.36. This resulted in a YTD deficit of \$45,557.13. Even though this is discouraging it is not unusual. At this time last year, we had a deficit of over \$67,000.

The capital fund balance as of 2/28/2025 is \$289,429.16. This number is expected to be reduced to \$87,597.23 as we finish all of the projects that have been approved and are ongoing as well as the \$100,000 commitment to phase 1 of the HVAC project.

The contract for the first phase of the HVAC Project was signed. The first installment was made the first week of March.

The Trustees approved several projects to be completed in the kitchen: 1) caulk the back of the three-compartment sink, 2) replace the grid and ceiling tiles, 3) replace the lights with LED lights, 4) repair and paint where paint is damaged or peeling. The total cost should not exceed \$8,300.

Cindy McMillan, Director of Finance & Operations

Finance

The Finance Committee met on Tuesday, March 18, and reviewed the February 2025 financial statements. DW ended February with a deficit of \$21,905.36. This resulted in a year-to-date deficit of \$45,557.13. It is not uncommon for the church to run a deficit at this time of year.

The CDC ended February with a profit of \$10,798.41 which resulted in a year-to-date gain of \$12,168.00. They are performing better than anticipated.

The silent campaign has been quite successful in obtaining pledges of \$468,906. Currently, we have received \$295,906 of those pledges. We made the first payment on the HVAC project in March. The second payment will be due the end of April. We hope to receive the balance remaining from the silent campaign by the time the second payment is due. The silent campaign along with previous commitments, will get us very close to covering the entire first phase of the HVAC project.
